

Labrador Uranium Announces Upsize of Bought Deal Private Placement to C\$8.0 Million

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TORONTO, April 11, 2022 - [Labrador Uranium Inc.](#) ("LUR" or "Labrador Uranium") (CSE: LUR) (F: E11) is pleased to announce that due to significant investment demand, LUR has agreed to amend its agreement with Red Cloud Securities Inc., as lead underwriter and sole bookrunner on behalf of a syndicate of underwriters (collectively, the "Underwriters"), to increase the size of LUR's previously announced bought deal private placement from C\$7.0 million to C\$8.0 million. Under the revised offering, the Underwriters have agreed to purchase for resale 5,715,000 flow-through units of LUR to be sold to charitable purchasers (each, a "Charity FT Unit") at a price of C\$1.40 per Charity FT Unit (the "Unit Price") on a "bought deal" private placement basis for gross proceeds of C\$8,001,000 (the "Offering").

Each Charity FT Unit will consist of one common share of LUR to be issued as a "flow-through share" within the meaning of the Income Tax Act (Canada) (each, a "FT Share") and one-half of one common share purchase warrant (each whole warrant, a "Warrant") that is not being issued on a flow-through basis. Each Warrant shall entitle the holder to purchase one common share of LUR (each, a "Warrant Share") at a price of C\$1.40 per Warrant Share at any time on or before the date which is 24 months after the closing date of the Offering.

LUR has granted the Underwriters an option to purchase for resale up to 1,429,000 additional Charity Ft Units at the Unit Price to raise additional gross proceeds of up to C\$2,000,600 (the "Over-Allotment Option"). The Over-Allotment Option will be exercisable in whole or in part, up to 48 hours prior to the closing date of the Offering.

The net proceeds from the sale of the Charity FT Units will be used for the exploration of the LUR's projects in Labrador, Canada and for "Canadian Exploration Expenses" (within the meaning of the Income Tax Act (Canada)) (the "Qualifying Expenditures"), which will be renounced with an effective date no later than December 31, 2022 to the purchasers of the Charity FT Units in an aggregate amount not less than the gross proceeds raised from the issue of the Charity FT Units.

The Offering is scheduled to close on or about April 28, 2022, and is subject to certain conditions, including, but not limited to, the receipt of all necessary regulatory and other approvals, including the approval of the Canadian Securities Exchange. The securities issued pursuant to the Offering will be subject to a hold period of four-month and one day from the closing date of the Offering.

The securities being offered have not been, nor will they be, registered under the United States Securities Act of 1933, as amended, and such securities may not be offered or sold within the United States absent U.S. registration or an applicable exemption from U.S. registration requirements. Labrador Uranium is engaged in the exploration and development of uranium projects in Labrador, Canada. LUR has acquired the Moran Lake and CMB Projects covering over 139,000 ha in the prolific Central Mineral Belt (CMB) in central Labrador and the Notakwanon Project in northern Labrador. Both the Moran Lake Project, which hosts historical uranium mineral resources, and the CMB Project, located adjacent to Paladin Energy's Michelin uranium deposit, have had substantial past exploration work completed with numerous targets with uranium, copper and IOCG style mineralization. The Notakwanon Project is underexplored but drill ready. All three projects are expected to be the focus of an aggressive exploration program in 2022.
